FASD Training

FASD (Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder) in partnership with Inclusion Agency Tasmania, Gowrie Training & Consultancy, have organised a professional development session facilitated by Vicki Russell from FASD Tasmania.

The presentation will include:

 Overview of FASD – context – the impact of alcohol in society and particularly women's use; the impact of alcohol at a cellular level and epigenetics; prevalence (international, national and state rates), Australian diagnostic instrument and diagnostic process

- Presentation of FASD impact on development – brain and physical – presenting difficulties across the lifespan, identifying risk factors.
- Strategies to support the inclusion of children (FASD) within daily education and care programs Vicki will draw on her experience and Certificate of Mastery in a neurobehavioural approach (USA).
